The Second Reading: 1 John 1:1,3,5-9

This is the message we have heard from God and proclaim to you, that God is light and in God there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with God while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. The word of God from: Acts 4:32-35 *C: Glory to you, O God.*

Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. (NRSV)

Message (Imagine Pastor Janaki's voice here ©)

Many a time I have shared with you my experience of "coming to Christ" ... a more accurate way to put it would be my experience of Christ coming to me ... it was not a case of someone proselytizing or preaching at me, it was not a case of "back to church Sunday" where I was invited by someone ... rather it was a true and thrashing case of the dark night of the soul. I was in a fearful, hurt and even shameful state. So much so that I felt strongly suicidal. And I was not at the time, a believer in Jesus Christ as my salvation. But I believed in a kind of NO NAME God ... and I prayed earnestly like this: "God please show me whatever it is you need me to see." For a month I prayed in this way every night and on the last Friday night of that month, the revelation of Jesus descended on me ... there were no fireworks, there was no organ music, but my soul was re-ignited by the love God demonstrated in sending to us a Son, who would die for us, so that we could not ever be separated from God again.

I felt as though God had, through revealing Jesus to me in this deeply intimate way, in a time of my own soul's thrashing about, I felt as though God had plucked me from darkness, flipped on a big light switch, and in so doing brought me, through Jesus, into the light.

Because I had grown up in a "Christian" country, I decided to go to church and ask to be baptized. Because I felt that church was where the gospel would be lived out.

Bonnie Berg read two scriptures for us today, and I share my story in relation to both the scriptures she had read.

No, I was not a real-time witness to the real-time crucifixion of Jesus by the Roman authorities. But I had gone through some things in life when I was at that desperate praying juncture that had truly challenged the image of God

within my own self. It was as though that image of God within me had been crucified, and without it, there was only me, in the dark room of my own regrets and emptiness, scared and disconnected from God.

In this way, my experience was like that of the disciples, huddled in the room in fear, after Jesus' crucifixion ... not sure what had happened to their Messiah. Scared, probably ashamed for abandoning him, likely some measure of PTSD at play. The last thing they expected was to have Jesus enter through those closed doors, the Jesus they had seen murdered.

Stay-At-Home orders can also set this stage ... huddled in our homes, fearful of infections now especially with the more infectious variants of concern, we sit kind of waiting, wondering: what next?

But Jesus came, Jesus comes, entering into that dark confined space as Jesus entered into my dark night of the soul ... breathing the Holy Spirit onto me, onto you, onto each one of us ... instructing us in forgiveness, granting us this incredible, grace-blanket of forgiveness, and sending us out.

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

When we receive the light of God, when we truly receive the Holy Spirit, we enter into a whole other kind of struggle ... we become creatures of divine light ... "God is light and in God there is no darkness at all.

If we say that we have fellowship with God while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true;

but if we walk in the light as God's own self is light, we have fellowship with one another."

What powerful truth ... for even through stay at home orders, even through lockdowns, even through the various violences COVID has visited upon us – we have had this incredible fellowship with us. Jesus has crossed through closed doors, through masks, through safe distancing spaces, drawn close enough to each one of us to breathe on us: -Spirit breath,

- -witness breath,
- -the breath of resurrection life.

And we are instructed: "RECEIVE the Holy Spirit" ... Reception requires open hands and open hearts, for :

- -how can I receive anything into these hands when my fists are clenched?
- -How can I receive anything into this heart, when unforgiveness, when grudge holding, when fear and scarcity hold me captive?
- -How can I walk in the light when I cling to darkness?

It is entirely impossible – God can shower us with Spirit – receiving is on us. Receiving is an instruction – we can choose to obey or not obey. God can shine light on us, but we must open our eyes if we are to receive anything but darkness ...

Throughout the season of Easter, we read from the Book of Acts. Many of us have not spent much time studying this book. Yet we claim to be Christians, and we claim we want to see growth in the body of Christ: the church. If we really want to see this infectious disease of Christ witness occur, reading the book of Acts is some essential schooling. Not one of us has seen more than a few baptisms occur at a time; in the book of Acts it was happening in the thousands.

Because of the power of witness in drawing people towards the light of God ...

When I was in seminary and learning language tools, I remember studying the word Greek word, "martureo". It means¹ to be a witness, to bear witness, i.e. to affirm that one has seen or heard or experienced something, or that he knows it because taught by divine revelation or inspiration

- a. to give (not to keep back) testimony
- b. to utter honourable testimony, give a good report

The online study tool I used to cite this definition says this root word for witness, martureo occurs 81 times in the New Testament ... 31 times in the Gospel of John, and 11 times in the book of Acts. So, more than half of the times this word is used occurs between these two books.

As a new Christian – meaning one who had received a divine revelation of Jesus, I went to join a church community and be baptized because I believed in the church as a collective witness of the good news of Jesus. In the book of ACTS, it is the acts of witness of those who came to believe in Jesus that moved so many to curiosity, to openness, so that they too could receive the Holy Spirit.

As modern-day Christians, we have travelled a long long distance from those early Jesus-followers, from whom sprung this infectious spreading of the Gospel. What of this description can we truly claim today:

- -the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul,
- -no one claimed private ownership of any possessions,
- -everything they owned was held in common.
- -They gave their testimony or witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus,
- -there was not a needy person among them
- -for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold.
- -it was distributed to each as any had need.

What do we hold in common, to be shared with any as have need?

Are we of one heart and soul as believers?

Do we bear witness to the powerful love of God in Jesus?

Are there needy around us and among us?

Or are we still huddled in a closed off space, fists closed, hearts closed, waiting to receive that which God has given to us?

People join church communities, and leave for a variety of reasons.

I joined a church because I wanted to share my incredible witness, to walk as a child of the light. I wanted, and want ever-more, to walk with Jesus.

Let us be open to God's light.

Let us receive the peace Jesus begins.

Let us receive Holy Spirit.

Let us share our witness and walk with Jesus. Amen.
